The Stagg Bowl kicks off Friday, December 17 at 7:04 PM ET. Gates open at 5:30 PM ET. Tickets are on sale now at NCAA.com/tickets. General admission stadium seating tickets cost \$20. Student and youth general admission stadium seating cost is \$10 per ticket, for children under 18 or with a valid student i.d. A limited quantity of club seats are available featuring club access and premium cushioned stadium seats centrally located on the first level of the south stands. Club access tickets cost \$35.
